Having Uriel in my class these past few years reminded me of why I became a teacher in the first place. He was curious, challenging, stubborn, smart, and energetic. Every day, I had to figure out ways to keep him interested in learning and he made me a better teacher and person.

He loved to tell stories, pull pranks, and make everyone laugh. He was so excited to start the new school year and proud to be the only student to come to school on the first day with all his school supplies.

He wanted people to think he was tough and indifferent, but he had too big of a heart to fool anyone. He was a kind and gentle soul who brightened every room he entered. He had the best smile and laugh.

My favorite thing about Uriel is that he embraced and included everyone. He was confident and never afraid to meet new people. He always entered my classroom saying hello or good morning. He was friendly and social; he made our students feel cared for and important.

Uriel shared his life with me and others in such an open and honest way. He did not pretend to be anyone other than Uriel. He appreciated any help he received and always expressed how he was feeling. He was thoughtful, mischievous, polite, goofy, fun-loving, creative, energetic,

talented, and a pleasure to know. He was one of the main reasons I looked forward to coming to work and I will miss him every day.

NSSEO School Safety Plan Update -

NSSEO has an established NSSEO district-wide Safety Committee which includes NSSEO staff, first responders, community agencies, parent participation and a representative from the NSSEO Governing Board. An essential role of our committee is to continually assess, plan, develop, and audit safety solutions. New safety measures being adopted by NSSEO this year include updating our NSSEO School Safety Plan, integration of the School Safety Plan with the Crisis Go app, and the establishment of a Parent Information Site.

In 2007, NSSEO adopted a Standardized School Safety Plan. In alignment with the Illinois State Board of Education requirements, this plan is reviewed and updated annually with representatives from our local fire and police departments. This year, NSSEO is in the process of updating our plan in alignment with the I Love You Guys response protocol endorsed by the Arlington Heights Police Department and adopted by several of NSSEO member districts.

I Love You Guys Foundation

It was a tragedy that launched the I Love You Guys Foundation. Ellen and John-Michael Keyes started the foundation after losing their daughter, Emily, during the Platte Canyon High School shooting. Emily sent a text to her parents that day saying, "I love u guys." Soon after, Ellen and John-Michael Keyes turned their focus to bringing together schools, families, communities, government entities and other organizations in an effort to increase the safety of students and staff.

The "I Love U Guys" Foundation's programs for crisis response and post-crisis reunification are used in more than 45,000 schools, districts, departments, agencies, organizations and communities around the world. They are created through the research-based best practices of school administrators, psychologists, public space safety experts, families, and first responders.

Another update to NSSEO's safety procedures is establishing NSSEO's Parent Information Site. In partnership with the Arlington Heights Park District, NSSEO has identified the Arlington Ridge Center as a place where our parents would gather and access critical information during a crisis.

NSSEO Heartbeat of the Week, Kari Benjilany




