1 p.m. -- Special Keynote and Welcome Address by Dr. Tony Sanders A Vision for Special Education



Dr. Sanders received his bachelor's degree from the University of Illinois Springfield, his Master of Business Administration from New York Institute of Technology, his Chief School Business Official Endorsement from Northern Illinois University, an Honorary Doctor of Laws from Judson University, and his Doctor of Education from Aurora University. Dr. Sanders also has advocated at the state and federal levels as a member and past chair of the Large Countywide and Suburban District Consortium. He supported the effort to reform Illinois' school funding formula and enact Evidence-Based Funding and to pass the Every Student Succeeds Act. Prior to becoming the U-46 superintendent in 2014, Dr. Sanders served as the district's chief of communications and accountability and then chief of staff. He also previously served as the chief communications officer for St. Louis Public Schools and in communications and governmental relations roles within Illinois government, including at ISBE.

Dr. Zelphine Smith-Dixon, a native of Orangeburg County in South Carolina, is a newly elected board member of the Council for Exceptional Children. She participated with the Technical Work Group as one of nine individuals in the country to advise on special education funding and finance.

Dr. Smith-Dixon has completed various educational studies: K-12 education in Orangeburg Consolidated School District 3; bachelor's degree in Special Education from Columbia College, Master of Education in Elementary Education from South Carolina State University, and a Doctor of Education in Educational Leadership from Nova Southeastern University. She has received the following accolades: Tri-County Special Educator of the Year, Vance-Providence Elementary Teacher of the Year, and Orangeburg Consolidated School District 3 Alternate District Teacher of the Year. Columbia College in South Carolina presented her with the Wil Lou Gray Outstanding Educator Award in April 2018.
